#### Lesson plan

Level A2

**Aims** To express likes and dislikes and discuss the importance of different sports in

the lives of young people.

#### Language

# PREMIER SKILLS ENGLISH



### Before you watch: (10 minutes)

Hand out post-it-notes and ask students to write <u>one adjective</u> on their post-it-note to describe what they like about the Premier League.

Each student comes up to the board and sticks their note on the board.

How many students wrote the same adjective? Discuss other possible adjectives.

In pairs students have to write one sentence to describe the Premier League using at least two adjectives from the board:

i.e. The Premier League is exciting to watch because it is never boring and is very professional.

# Activity 1: Who said what? (20 minutes)

# a) Watch (Image off / Sound only)

Ask students to listen for, and write down the adjectives used by the fans to describe why they like the Premier League.

Ask a few students to read their sentences to the class.

#### Post Watching: (Total 50-60 minutes)

Juan likes the players' honesty and Shafai likes how fast and tough the game is. What do you like about the Premier League?

Ask students:

What sport do you like?

What sport do you dislike?

Write up the list of sports mentioned; discuss what equipment you need to play each sport and whether it is an individual sport or a team sport.

#### Activity 3: Class OR Group Game (20-30 minutes)

One student comes up to the front of the class and takes a card with the name and picture of a sport. The class has to ask questions, in the present simple, to find out which sport the student has. The student can only answer yes or no.

i.e., Do you play it indoors or outdoors? Do you play it in a team?

Do you need a ball? Do you need a pitch? Do you need a racquet? Do you need a bicycle? etc.

#### **Activity 4: Follow-up writing (20 minutes)**

- a. Ask students to write a description of a football player or someone famous, using adjectives.
- b. Students need to swap their description with a partner and guess which famous person their partner is describing.
