

1. Vocabulary: English  
The game: advantage

Example: After a foul, a referee can call **advantage** if the team that was fouled will benefit more from letting play continue than from the referee stopping play and awarding a free kick.



2. Vocabulary: English  
The game: defensive wall

Example: When a player has been awarded a direct free kick, the defending team can try to stop the attacker from scoring by forming a **defensive wall** in front of the goal.



3. Vocabulary: English  
The game: equaliser

Example: When a team is losing by one goal, if the losing team scores a goal that makes the scores equal, that goal is called an **equaliser**.



4. Vocabulary: English  
The game: header

Example: When a player controls the ball with his head, it is called a **header**. Many goals are scored through **headers** from corner kicks.



5. Vocabulary: English  
The game: in play

Example: When the ball is **in play**, any player can try to take the ball and score a goal.



6. Vocabulary: English  
The game: open goal

Example: When there is no defender or goalkeeper between an attacking player and the goal, the goal is an **open goal**.



7. Vocabulary: English  
The game: out of play

Example: If a ball crosses the goal line or touchline, it is **out of play**. The ball is put back in play with a throw in, corner kick or goal kick.



8. Vocabulary: English  
The game: own goal

Example: If a player scores against his team, that player has scored an **own goal**.



9. Vocabulary: English  
The game: possession

Example: The time when a player or team have the ball is called **possession**. When a player is tackled, they lose **possession**.



10. Vocabulary: English  
The game: penalty shootout

Example: At the end of a match, in a knockout round of a competition, if there is no winner, the match is decided with a **penalty shootout**. The teams take turns to take penalties to find a winner.
